The Hartington City Council met for their regular meeting on May 12th, 2025 at City Hall beginning at 5:00 P.M. Notice of time and place of the meeting was given in advance notice by posting. Notice of time and place of the meeting was communicated in the advanced notice to the Mayor and Council.

Present were Mayor Becker; Councilman Bartling, Christensen, Kathol, and Sudbeck; City Clerk-Treasurer Benscoter, Deputy Clerk Schulte, and Legal Counsel Brandt.

Mayor Becker called the meeting to order at 5:00 P.M., followed by all present reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion to approve the minutes from the April 28th, 2025 meeting and April, 2025 Treasurer's report was made by Councilman Sudbeck and seconded by Councilman Kathol. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Council reviewed an Application for Permit to Sell Permissible Fireworks at Retail by Fly By Night Fireworks. Clerk Benscoter explained that she spoke with them and they stated it was the exact same as last year and at the same location. A motion to approve the Application for Permit to Sell Permissible Fireworks at Retail by Fly By Night Fireworks was made by Councilman Kathol and seconded by Councilman Christensen. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Mayor Becker stated last year there were concerns with the safety of children on the highway during the fireworks display. He stated the event is getting larger and asked if there was a way to be able to close the highway. Clerk Benscoter explained Council could approve a Resolution to close off the highway like they do for the parade and then it has to be approved by the Nebraska Department of Transportation. She stated there has to be an alternate route for people to get around. Mayor Becker asked to have that on the next meeting.

Councilman Sudbeck introduced Resolution 20250512 for the Sale of Real Property. The Resolution would be for the sale of Old Firehall located at 102 E. Centre Street with a minimum reserve of \$200,000. A motion to approve Resolution 20250512 for the Sale of Real Property was made by Councilman Bartling and seconded by Councilman Christensen. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Councilman Kathol reviewed the bid the City received for the siding of the Shelter House. He stated three people contacted him with interest, but only one bid was turned into the City from Randy Kathol Construction for \$20,824. He stated they could wait, but it is getting pretty bad and the work would be done in the fall after the summer use of the Shelter House. A motion to approve the bid from Randy Kathol Construction for siding of the Shelter House at \$20,824 was made by Councilman Sudbeck and seconded by Councilman Kathol. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Mayor Becker presented the Interlocal Agreement for Use of School Buses. Clerk Benscoter explained this was the yearly agreement signed for the use of a school bus for summer activities such as swimming. It is the same agreement as last year. A motion to approve the Interlocal Agreement for Use of School Buses was made by Councilman Bartling and seconded by Councilman Christensen. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Mayor Becker introduced the appointment of Chase Dettman to the Hartington Volunteer Fire Department by Fire Chief Ryan Marsh. A motion to approve Chase Dettman to the Hartington Volunteer Fire Department was made by Councilman Bartling and seconded by Councilman Christensen. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Mayor Becker introduced the resignation of City Clerk – Treasurer, Brittni Benscoter as of May 20th, 2025. Himself and Council thanked her for everything she has done for the City in the past 2 years. A motion to approve the resignation of City Clerk – Treasurer, Brittni Benscoter as of May 20th, 2025 was made by Councilman Bartling and seconded by Councilman Christensen. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

The April, 2025 Cedar County Sheriff's Report was reviewed. There were 401 hours patrolled. School traffic was 2 hours. Calls of service were 1 Welfare Check, 1 EMS Assist, 2 Traffic Controls. Traffic stops were 3 Verbal Warning, 1 Written Warning, and 0 Citations. 0 Arrests were made.

Clerk Benscoter introduced 3 building permits; Jerrold and Casey Schulte for a storage shed, Holy Trinity Early Learning Center for a storage shed, and Lisa Dendinger for a fire incinerator. She stated the fire incinerator was outside of City limits and Fire Chief Ryan Marsh spoke to her and he stated he did not have any issues with it. A motion to approve building permits for Jerrold and Casey Schulte, Holy Trinity Early Learning Center, and Lisa Dendinger was made by Councilman Christensen and seconded by Councilman Kathol. A roll call vote was taken. Bartling – yes, Christensen – yes, Kathol – yes, Sudbeck – yes. Motion carried.

Department Reports:

Park – Councilman Kathol: The matting for the court has been put down and they painted pickleball court lines.

Pool –Councilman Bartling: The pool is set to open around the 26th, they will be cleaning it this week and sign up night is tonight.

Complex/Auditorium – Councilman Sudbeck: As of now there are 2 bidders very interested in the track and they have a few options in different types of track. If they go with asphalt there are grant opportunities as well. Councilman Kathol asked about funding for the project and Councilman Sudbeck stated they have some money in the Verizon rental account and the complex accounts that can be put towards the project.

Fire/Ambulance-Councilman Christensen: none.

General – Mayor Becker: none.

Legal Counsel Nikki Brandt: The City has received a summons regarding a property that was bought on a tax sale with a lien the City has on the property. She stated the City could remove the lien, which was put on in 2022 for non-payment of a transfer station bill of around \$240, or the City can keep the lien and if the person selling the property gets more than they bought it from, the City would then get its money.

Clerk Benscoter: It is time for health insurance renewal and the rates will be going up 18% this year for around \$1,100 estimated increase per month. She stated Matt Dresden did do comparisons and this policy is still the cheapest in comparison to plans, even with the increase.

Deputy Clerk Schulte: none.

Public Comments: Rob Dump with Cedar County News asked what the City's intentions were on replacing the City Clerk – Treasurer. Mayor Becker stated they are in talks with Deputy Clerk Schulte and will have decisions soon and then can advertise for a Deputy Clerk if she takes the position.
